



## FPP Pattern pieces for label

### Tips for paper piecing

Each letter of the Fraktal logo has been created as a simple Foundation Paper Pieced (FPP) block. Each letter is  $1\frac{3}{4}$ " high and where needed has a spacer to the next letter. You can change the size of the finished label by changing the top and side borders.

I have added 2" borders which then give you a finished patch  $15\frac{3}{4}$ " x  $5\frac{3}{4}$ " (or  $15\frac{1}{4}$ " x  $5\frac{1}{4}$ " if you then sew it in or fold over the  $\frac{1}{4}$ " edges).

The top and bottom borders are:  $12\frac{1}{4}$ " x 2"

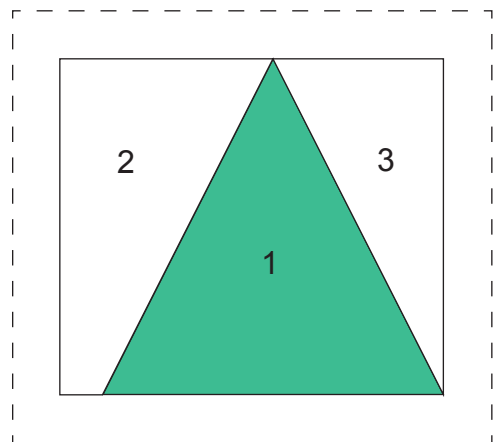
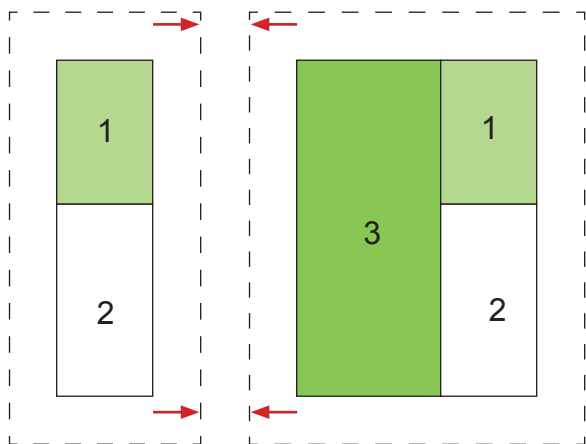
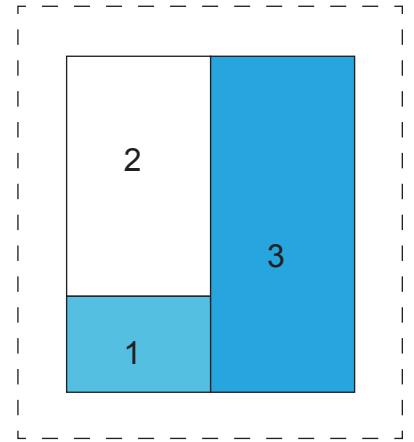
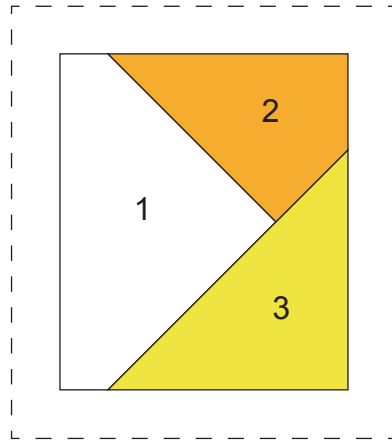
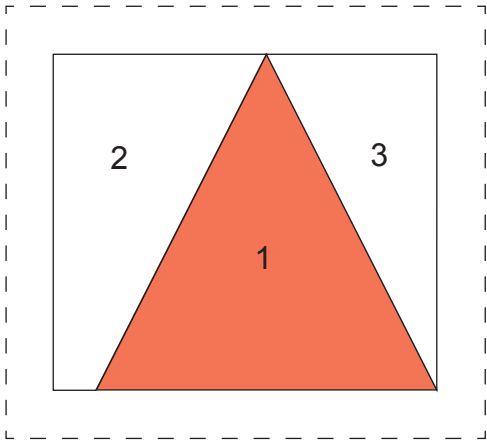
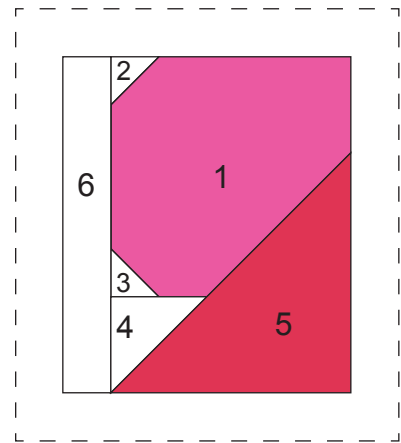
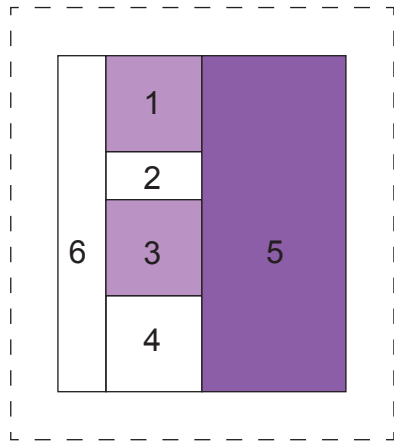
The side borders are: 2" x  $5\frac{3}{4}$ "



### Tips for paper piecing

- Firstly the most important tip is to make sure that you have printed the pattern out at actual size. To do this set your scaling to 100 % and then make sure you use that the 1 inch square measures 1 inch when printed.
- Use the lightest paper you can, you can use some cheap printer paper, the lower the g/m<sup>2</sup> number of the paper the better, or specific Foundation Paper piecing paper by Pattern Trace.
- Use a shorter stitch than usual, this makes it far easier to remove the paper afterwards. I set my machine to 1.5
- Use a matching thread and if you have some, then a thinner thread like Aurifil 80 weight can help to keep those seams flat.
